CERTIFICATION

Students successfully completing the program are prepared to sit for an American Society for Quality (ASQ) certification exam. The appropriate level of exam will depend upon individual participant education and experience. The different ASQ certification levels include Quality Improvement Associate (CQIA), Quality Inspector (CQI), and for the more experienced with a Bachelor's Degree, the Quality Technician (CQT).

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Students who successfully complete this training program will be prepared to seek positions requiring knowledge of regulated and international quality systems, continuous improvement techniques, and understanding of the tools used to have a positive impact on an employer's bottom line. *Quality Improvement Associate and Quality*

FAQs

Am I a good fit for the Quality program? A Career Development Coach or Career Center Case Manager will meet with you one-on-one to discuss your interests and skill levels to determine whether or not the training is a good fit for you.

What is the cost? The Training Program costs \$3,125. There will be no cost if you qualify for the grant.

When will the next session begin? The next session will begin on May 15 2017. Please connect with the Career Development Coach to learn upcoming training program dates and enrollment deadlines.

How long is the training? The training encompasses 120-hours in the classroom and is offered in a 6-week format scheduled as Monday-Thursday from 9:30am -3:00pm.

Do I need to take an admission test? You must pass the TABE Assessment in Reading and Math at an 8th grade level or above.

You must complete a Section 30 application to notify MA Department of Unemployment Assistance Training Opportunities Program (TOP) that you intend to attend training and wish to continue to receive your unemployment benefits.
